

**MAIN STREET** ☞

**1) Old Nicholas County Jail**

Built between 1820-23. Building was used as the jail and jailer's home from 1857 until the 1980's. Back addition was added in 1891.

Renovated in 1991 for use as the Visitors and Information Center.

**2) Smedley House**

c. 1820. Built as a residence, it became Cap Fulton's barber shop. Cap boasted that he was "the biggest liar in town". He displayed a liar's license on the wall. Dormers were added after a fire in 1900. A pressed tin ceiling is still visible.

**3) Chevis House**

c. 1825. Building has served as a residence for 165 years.

**4) Santee & White Building**

c. 1860. The "Golden Rule" grocery was located on the upper side of the building and the Santee & White millinery shop on the lower side. Building has been a residence.

**5) J.T. Sims/Neal Building**

c. 1883. Building has housed a grocery and the "Mozart Hall". In the late 1800's, the "Mozart Hall" was home to traveling musicians and vocalists who entertained the townspeople. Later, building was the home of a variety store called "Noah's Ark". From 1932 to 2003, the Neal family operated a business in this location. In 2003, the Neal family donated the building to the Nicholas County Historical Society and it is currently being renovated to serve as a welcome center for visitors of Carlisle.

**6) Adair Building**

Since 1873 building has been a confectionery, barber shop, undertakers, pool hall, furniture shop, and restaurants.

**7) Veach Building**

Built in 1873. Building has housed a jewelry store, restaurants, clothing, tailoring, and bicycle shops.

**8) Morgan & Spencer Building**

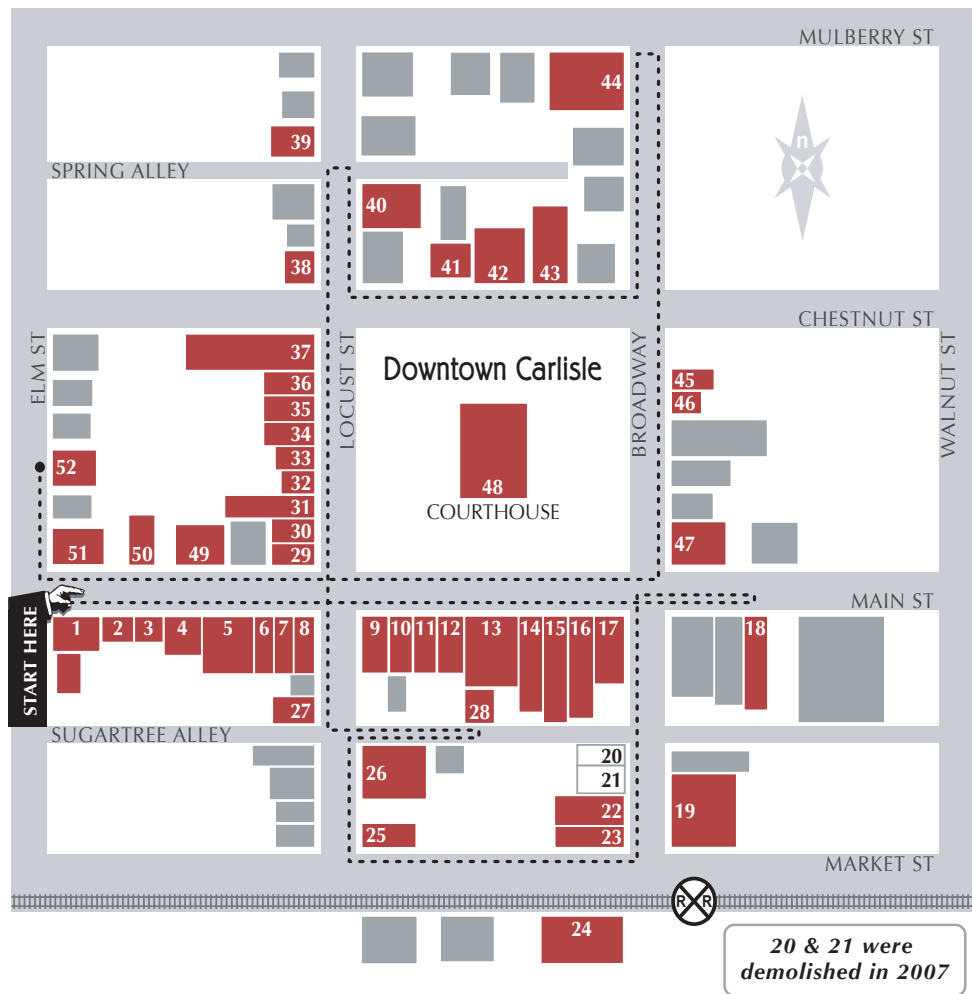
Built by Morgan & Spencer in 1874 and known as "The City Store". Building has housed a dry goods store, restaurant, tin shop and 5&10.

**9) Carlisle Deposit Bank**

Built in 1900 by I.N. Handley. The bank was organized in 1866 and continues to provide banking services today.

**10) Kirkland Building**

Built in 1892. Building has been



a general store, clothing store, and a real estate office.

**11) Dougherty Building**

c.1850. Built by John Dougherty. Building had a bank and storeroom on the first floor, offices on the second, and a masonic hall on the third. Building has housed a drugs store, Potts & Mathers funeral home, grocery, clothing and jewelry stores.

**12) Farmers Bank**

c.1905. Founded by Thomas Pickrell. Since 1918 Hopkins Drug Co. has served from this location.

**13) Frey Building**

Erected in 1892. Building has housed a hardware store, a meat and grocery store, druggist, jeweler and pool room.

**14) Henry Building**

Built in 1886. Building used as a grocery, hardware store and other businesses. Since 1920 a drug store has been in operation.

**15) Sam Howe Building**

Built in 1897. Building has served as a clothing, printing, furniture and grocery store.

**16) Efron Building**

W.D. and C.C. Ratliff built this building in 1898. After 1940, the art deco facade and carrara glass were

added.

**17) C.C. Cole Building**

Built in 1900. Original location of the St. Cloud Hotel. Building has housed clothing stores, restaurants and barbers.

**18) Unknown**

Currently being researched.

**SOUTH BROADWAY** ☞

**19) Ratliff Building**

Built in 1883. Building has housed a wholesale grocery, hardware store, and lumber company. Upper building added a later date.

**20) Ginger Ale Works**

c.1886. Building has been a pool hall, drug store, saloon, grocery and ginger ale works.

**21) Broom Factory**

c.1886. Building has housed a grocery and butcher shop, restaurant, hardware store, clothing store, broom factory and bottling works.

**22) R.R. Templeman Hogshead Factory**

Built in 1909. Building has served as a bottling works and a flour and supply warehouse.

**23) Dorsey Bros. & Fisher Hardware**  
Built between 1909-1916. Building also used as a seed and paint store and an electrician's shop.

**MARKET STREET ☞**

**24) Freight Depot**

Before 1875, building was used as a freight depot. Adam's Express office and Western Union Telegraph used building at a later date.

**25) Carlisle Passenger Depot**

Built in 1912 and renovated in 1981 by the Nicholas County Historical Society. Home of the Nicholas County History Museum providing several genealogical records and historical artifacts. The Carlisle Women's Club furnished the garden area and used iron railing that was originally part of the courthouse yard.

**LOCUST STREET ☞**

**26) Masonic Lodge**

Built in 1914. Once home of a theater and presently serves as a masonic lodge and funeral home.

**27) Hamilton Building**

Built in 1901 by Lizzie and Mason Hamilton. Building has served as a movie house, undertakers, printing house, notions and offices.

**SUGAR TREE ALLEY ☞**

**28) Stable**

c.1900. Stable used to house horses of guests in nearby hotel. Horses and buggies were also "for hire".

**UPPER LOCUST STREET ☞**

**29) Old First National Bank Building**

Built between 1903-1909. The builder was E.W. Smith of Lexington, Kentucky.

**30) Tureman Building**

c.1840. Built by Joseph F. Tureman. Building used to sell notions and pharmaceuticals. Interior still holds much of the original character.

**31) Dry Goods Store**

Built in 1897-1903. Building has been the location of a dry goods store, photo shop and variety store.

**32) Old Bank Building**

Built in 1880. Early home of the Carlisle Deposit Bank.

**33) Mercury Building**

c. 1886. Building first served as a

residence and later held offices. In 1947, the "Carlisle Mercury" newspaper office opened here.

**34) Dykes/Holliday House**  
c.1820. Residence of Judge Holliday in the mid-1800's.

**35) Ficklin/Pickrell House**

c.1850. Owned by Paulina and Clarissa Ficklin.

**36) Harry Smith King House**

c.1900.

**37) Carlisle Christian Church**

Building was erected in 1881 and set back from the street with a front yard enclosed with an iron fence. Back of the building was used for a school of higher learning called the "Carlisle Academy". In 1889, front of the building was built.

**38) Fritts Home**

Built before the Civil War by W.W. Fritts who later became a doctor. Building has housed doctor's offices through its entire history.

**39) Academy**

Built 1874-1880 by the City of Carlisle as an academy. Later, Mr. Vance bought the building and ran the academy for several years.

**40) First Baptist Church**

Built in 1902. Land was owned by Mrs. Tureman originally and contained her rose garden. She donated the land for the building of the church.

**CHESTNUT STREET ☞**

**41) Dr. G.W. Grimes House**

Built in 1900. Building became the Carlisle United Methodist Church annex at a later date.

**42) Carlisle United Methodist Church**

Built in 1900. Building cost was \$18,000 and was dedicated in 1904. Beautiful stained glass windows are installed in building. Congregation was first organized in 1821.

**43) City Hall**

Built in 1912. Building houses the city offices and the police department.

**BROADWAY ☞**

**44) Carlisle Presbyterian Church**

Original building built in 1829 and was used jointly by the Baptists and the Presbyterians. In 1878, the Presbyterians purchased their half interest in the building for \$1300. Remodeling of the building was begun and by 1889 was completed. Highlights include Gothic stained glass windows.

**45) Dr. Tilton's Office**

Built by Horace Metcalfe. From 1820's to 1830's, building served as a tailor shop for Greenberry Ross. In 1864, Dr. Tilton moved his dentist office to this location.

**46) Poweling-Booth House**

c.1879. Building is thought to have been built with logs from the first courthouse.

**47) Graeter Building**

Built by Fred Graeter in 1883. Mr. Graeter was a German baker known for his fine pastries. Building has housed assorted businesses.

**MAIN STREET ☞**

**48) Nicholas County Courthouse**

1893. The present building is the fourth courthouse. Brick masons were James and Robert George with stone work by Max Metzger. Originally the land was Samuel Kincart's 200 acre farm. Location of courthouse was the site of the Kincart's peach orchard. A monument in honor of John Kincart, Samuel's son and founder of Carlisle, is behind the courthouse.

**49) Lamar House**

Built in 1882 by Green Cheatham and used as a hotel until 1960.

**50) Lyric Theatre**

Built between 1903-1909. Building has housed the Lyric Theatre, the American Legion, an armory, a furniture store, a printing shop and dry cleaning shops.

**51) Dr. McNew House**

Built in 1886-1887. Built by Dr. Nelson McNew as his residence. Later, Sis Potts ran the Henderson Hotel from house. Building also used as a boarding house.

**ELM STREET ☞**

**52) Old Baptist Church**

Dedicated in 1879. Building cost was \$5000. It sold in 1900 and has been a residence since that time.

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
